## DEAN'S DOINGS

My Dear People and Friends of Bethesda:

It is somewhat impossible to fathom that I have been amongst you for a period as brief as five months, and yet so much has transpired. Presently we are enjoying the Church's Solemnities which adorn the conclusion of Paschaltide and launch us into a season of green. First, however, are the Feasts of the Blessed Trinity and, one week later, Corpus Christi.

Viewed collectively, these liturgical celebrations address a reality which cannot be subtly distanced from ordinary life: the indwelling of God. The Author and Giver of life indwells. This is the essence of Divine Being. The Son indwells, because he incarnates in us the origin of life in the kingdom, which he came to build and redeem. Inaugurating the Apostolic Age, the Holy Spirit indwells to ignite a mighty furnace that evidences the eternal glory and salvific nature of Christ's Resurrection. Arriving at the altar week by week, Jesus' Eucharistic Presence welcomes us to the sacred nature of his Body, both the Sacrament and its extension in and through the Church.

To cherish this distinct revelation, our hearts and minds need to connect with how God infuses himself into the ordinary mix of our humanity. I believe firmly that this began when Bethesda-ites gathered on Ascension Day for a special meeting of the congregation. Although most of the presentations addressed our very earth-bound sense of the kingdom, at the same time the heavenly dimension was also being revealed. God's disclosure is not manifest in secret. Nor should his indwelling be prized as ours alone.

It is my fervent prayer that the energy of Pentecost, the blessedness of the Most Holy Trinity, and the wonder of the Sacrament of Immortality govern our parish life. The tasks before us, without hesitation, are momentous. Yet God is constant in his pursuit of us, and so must we be of him.

I close with a very personal reflection: you have no conception of how much your worship and friendship has blessed my priestly work at Bethesda!

# THE VESTRY REPORTS

On the Feast of Our Lord's Ascension, May 17, a special meeting of the congregation was held following a Solemn Eucharist and a delicious and bountiful Pot Luck Supper. Herewith is a summary of the presentations.

## Bethesda Finances *presented by Darren Miller, Treasurer*

- For the first time in well over a decade, a parish budget now exists.
- Procedures for accountability and transparency are in place.
- Audits for 2010 and 2011 reveal deficit situations, nearly \$80,000 and \$70,000 respectively.
- The 2012 Budget indicates a nearly \$60,000 deficit.
- Pledge and plate giving falls short of previous years. A re-canvassing of the parish will commence immediately in hopeful anticipation that our projected deficit will be eliminated. A special mailing will include a copy of the 2012 Budget.
- Bethesda's commitment to pay the diocesan assessment is tripled from 2011; by 2015 it is expected that we will pay our obligation at 100%.
- Compensation to fund a Church School Director will conclude at the end of June, 2012.

## Rector Search Process *presented by Mary Withington*

- It is diocesan practice that the Vestry serves as the Search Committee and is the official body that will elect Bethesda's next Rector. Coordinating its efforts are Mary Withington [Chair], Darren Miller, John VanDerVeer, and Dean Vang.
- The time line adopted by the Coordinating Committee is as follows:

- Stage 1    Develop Parish Survey, *May – November 2012*
- Stage 2    Conduct Survey, compile Summary, *December – February 2013*
- Stage 3    Develop Parish Profile, *March – September 2013*
- Stage 4    Publicize Position, *September 2013 – January 2014*
- Stage 5    Select appropriate Candidates, *January – April 2014*
- Stage 6    Meet with Candidates and Select, *May – October 2014*
- Stage 7    Elect New Rector, *All Saints' Day, November 1, 2014*



New Home for Bethesda's Reed Organ

Before the Pierce Memorial organ was built there existed a 1932 Estey reed organ in the gallery of Bethesda. After many months of advertising it for sale, it was moved into storage to make way for the new organ.

Our Organ Curate, Daniel Lemieux, discovered a group of musicians who call themselves "The Low Anthem". In my opinion, their music can be described as "New age—folk". They play a wide variety of often unusual instruments, combining folk with blues, hymnals, barn-stompers and whispered meditations. The group was asked if they would be interested in our old organ and soon after, came to pick it up.

Their third album, Smart Flesh was released in February of 2011. Most recently they received fame by collaborating on the sound track of the movie, "The Hunger games" Songs from District 12 and Beyond, along with Carolina Chocolate Drops and Punch Brothers. The Huffington Post called the album "...a deftly meditative soundtrack to the movie adaptation of the best-selling book, bringing together big names and indie darlings of all stripes."

I was very impressed with their music after hearing their second album, "O My God, Charlie Darwin". It's very apparent that Jocie Adams, who, with her back round in Classical composition and arrangement, is clearly responsible for the sense of harmony that is evident in my favorite cuts of the album.

After years of scouring yard sales, attics and eBay, the band could easily open a second hand music shop, with sufficient peculiarities to be the envy of Brooklyn hipsters and historical preservation societies alike. Most notably they collect and repair antique pump organs, but have also gathered oversized drum kits, hammered dulcimers, autoharps, singing bowls, banjos, steel drums, crotals, horns of all shapes, and our old 600 pound reed organ. They are apparently obsessive scavengers, reverent of oddity and fanatical in the search for sound. The eclectic array of instruments used in their new album includes jaw harp, musical saw, stylophone, reed organ and an elaborate scheme to re-amp noise through various chambers in the previously abandoned factory that they use for recording.

I recommend that you learn more about The Low Anthem and keep your ears open for their next recording, which may feature our beloved Estey Reed Organ.
