THE SECOND LESSON - *A Reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians* Just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture—"I believed, and so I spoke" —we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal. For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. *(4:13-5:1)*

YOUR PLEDGE UP TO DATE: It is important that we honor our commitments in a timely manner. Our ministries continue, and so do the expenses that support them. Thank you.

The VESTRY in May agreed to seek approval from the City of Saratoga Springs to allow for supportive housing and shelter in the New Parish House. This use was not requested when we received our original approval in 2015. In the weeks since our housing initiative regarding Code Blue was communicated, we have learned of additional housing needs in the community that Bethesda could help to meet. Numerous groups and advocates have voiced support for Bethesda's direction, including those working with race course backstretch workers, victims of domestic violence, homeless military veterans and others. Receiving approval for this direction from the city will allow our discussions with these groups to move forward in a businesslike manner.

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Search Committee Is making final revisions to the Office for Transition Ministry Community Portfolio Information. The Search Committee met for the third week in a row to work on the portfolio on June 5. This meeting and the previous one were spent revising our answers to the narrative questions on the National Office for Transition Ministry's Community Portfolio Information. We have agreed to the answers to eleven of the twelve narrative questions and are making final edits. We hope to finish our work on formulating our answer to one of the questions in the coming week. Once we have all of them finalized we will share our draft with the Diocesan Transition Minister, Elizabeth Strickland. After getting her feedback, we will make any necessary changes and then submit the portfolio. As I indicated last week, it will be posted on the national Episcopal Church's database so that clergy can access it and apply for the open rector's position at Bethesda. As of Tuesday of this past week, 106 parishioners had responded to the survey. We thank all of you who have already completed the survey and invite those of you who have not yet done so to complete it as soon as possible. Even though the deadline has passed, your responses will still be part of the final report because I have not yet written it yet. You will need to respond soon, though, because I will begin work on it as soon as the portfolio is submitted. To pique your interest, here are a few more preliminary results: the typical respondent attends services nearly every week (42%) and almost one quarter (24 percent) attend every week. Over 60 percent report that their attendance has remained the same over the last five years, while 25 percent say it has decreased and 15 percent say it has increased.
