THE SECOND LESSON - *A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans.*

For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. But more than that, we even boast in God through our

Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.
