### **The First Lesson**

Jeremiah 15:15-21

O Lord, you know; remember me and visit me, and bring down retribution for me on my persecutors. In your forbearance do not take me away; know that on your account I suffer insult. Your words were found, and I ate them, and your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart; for I am called by your name, O Lord, God of hosts. I did not sit in the company of merrymakers, nor did I rejoice; under the weight of your hand I sat alone, for you had filled me with indignation. Why is my pain unceasing, my wound incurable, refusing to be healed? Truly, you are to me like a deceitful brook, like waters that fail. Therefore, thus says the Lord: If you turn back, I will take you back, and you shall stand before me. If you utter what is precious, and not what is worthless, you shall serve as my mouth. It is they who will turn to you, not you who will turn to them. And I will make you to this people a fortified wall of bronze; they will fight against you, but they shall not prevail over you, for I am with you to save you and deliver you, says the Lord. I will deliver you out of the hand of the wicked, and redeem you from the grasp of the ruthless.

Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. You are a stumbling block to me; for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." **Financial Update:** The Vestry gathered recently for its August meeting. The YTD plate & pledge receipts to the end of July is \$128,957. On average we are collecting \$4,298 per week for 2020. The average monthly expenses to operate the church are approximately \$5,000 per week. Based on our current average weekly collection, we anticipate income from plate & pledge for the remaining 22 Sunday collections (August – year end) to be approximately \$94,550. Based on these figures, we would end the year with a deficit of approximately \$15,000.

## **Guidelines for Attending Church**

### **Entry**

Do not enter if you are ill or have been in contact with someone who is ill.  
A mask is required and can be provided if you do not have one.  
Hand sanitizer is required and will be provided upon entry.  
We require your name and contact information.  
Sorry, no bathrooms available.

### **Offering**

Collection plates are at the rear of the church; thanks for dropping your envelope there!

### **Bulletins**

Are in the pews.

### **Seating**

8 am – sit in pews with **blue** tape.  
10 am – sit in pews with **purple** tape.

### **Peace**

6' apart - No touching – bow, sign, wave.

### **Communion**

Please follow ushers' instructions.  
Begins with people at the rear of the church. Distinct households remain 6' apart.  
Hand sanitizer is required and will be provided before communion.  
Only host will be distributed (sorry no wine).  
For communion, hold out your hands.  
For a blessing, cross your hands over your chest.  
Return to your seat via the side aisle on the left (the Gospel side).

### **Leaving**

Wait until the usher signals that it's your turn to leave.  
Place your bulletin in the wastebasket or take it home to recycle.
