The First Lesson Genesis 28:10-17

Jacob left Beersheba and went toward Haran. He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. And the Lord stood beside him and said, "I am the Lord, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring; and your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and all the families of the earth shall be blessed in you and in your offspring. Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, "Surely the Lord is in this place and I did not know it!" And he was afraid, and said, "How awesome is this place! Rid yourselves, therefore, of all malice, and all guile, insincerity, envy, and all slander. Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy







As fall approaches there are many new opportunities for learning, fun and fellowship with your fellow Bethesda parishioners:

Lectio Divina: Fall Bible Study continues Thursday, 8 October following Mid-day prayers. This week we will read chapters 13-16 of the Gospel according to Mark. We will meet in the church.

Bethesda Walkers (aka Legs Misérables) will meet on three consecutive Saturdays: 17 October, 24 October, and 31 October. On October 17, we will do a one mile walk along the nature trail in Moreau Lake State Park, starting from the beach parking lot at 10 am. The trail itself is three miles long. It is relatively, although not completely, flat. Some of it is paved and all of it is wide enough to allow for physical distancing across the width of the trail as well as along its length. We wanted to start with a more leisurely and shorter walk that would accommodate parishioners of all ages and abilities and so will only do the first half mile of the loop before turning around and returning to the parking lot. If some of the walkers want to do the entire

three-mile nature trail (it goes completely around the lake), just let us know and we will make that possible as well. Please bring a water bottle, wear sturdy shoes, and wear a mask. The walkers group is open to anyone interested in a walk in the woods and lively fellowship with fellow parishioners, friends and family. If you are going to walk and can provide transportation to someone who may need it, please let the office know.

Bethesda Book Club The Bethesda Book Club will meet periodically throughout the year. Our first meeting is scheduled for Thursday 22 October at 7pm when we will discuss The Plague, by Albert Camus.
