



The Fourth Sunday of Lent

Today, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, provides a respite from our Lenten fast. This day has various names, including **Mothering** Sunday, **Refreshment** Sunday and **Laetare** Sunday. The first title is a reference to the fact that this was the traditional day for young people "in service" (i.e. working as servants) to go home and visit their mums! In the UK and Commonwealth nations, Mothering Sunday is the original "mother's day" and reminds us of our natural mothers and also of our spiritual mother, the Church. This day is marked with a special holiday confection called Simnel cake, baked with fine flour, sugar, and dried fruit. In some churches—like Bethesda—it is the custom to bring Simnel cake to church to be blessed and shared. Why not join us for a slice?
