

The former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but Jesus holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he

has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.

### The Holy Gospel

Mark 10.46-52

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Mark. Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Jesus and his disciples came to Jericho. As he and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus stood still and said, "Call him here." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart; get up, he is calling you." So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. Then Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man said to him, "My teacher, let me see again." Jesus said to him, "Go; your faith has made you well." Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.



Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy people do celebrate and make, with these thy holy gifts which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; and looking for his coming again with power and great glory. ### **Community Events and Outreach**

**October Special Monthly Envelope** Donations to our monthly envelope for October will be divided between the feeding ministry at the local Presbyterian – United Church of Christ which provides meals to those in need; and Christ Church Food Pantry, a ministry operated by the Episcopal parish in Ballston Spa.

**Volunteers needed** Mary's Haven is a community home for the dying. The home accommodates two residents at a time. The house, which is funded through Catholic Charities, also depends heavily on the local community for donations. There is no charge to the families of residents. Volunteers, paid staff and a Hospice team care for the residents 24-hours a day. All volunteers receive appropriate training. Overall our expenses are running near budget Year to Date September, with lower Rectory maintenance costs, and some church repairs charged to Operational spending.

Year to date Giving is over budget, thanks to extra giving early in the year. As a result, our deficit is lower than expected at this point, and could close with strong 4th Quarter giving.
